Homelessness to Hope

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

A few years ago I met William (name changed). He has been attending Hospitality House for four years and he loves sports. I got to know him when he played on my basketball and baseball teams. He is wonderfully active! He is outgoing, much fun and has amazing crazy hair!

At the beginning of this year I noticed things were a bit different with William. He was more agitated, less able to focus, and often struggling with school work. He sometimes got into fights. I found out that things have not gone well for his family. They were homeless; living where they could and going from place to place. It is hard to imagine what William's life was like. I was concerned about his safety and care. How does a young child deal with being homeless: the confusion, constant change, shame? What does the future hold for William?



We prayed. Then Hospitality House began to help. Rev Hunter with his Shepherd's heart made some phone calls looking for ways to support William and his family. Through Hospitality House the family applied for and was able to stay at Sharing and Caring Hands. They got their own apartment, beds, and more! The kids had a stable place to stay and they got a family worker to assist.

As of this writing William and his family have signed a lease and just moved into their own permanent apartment. Hospitality House continues to help them by getting household items and supplies; beds, linens, food, transportation and more. We have connected them with other organizations to further help. We continue to pray for them and others who we know are struggling.

There has been a noticeable change in William; like a load has been lifted off this young man. He is working harder and is happier. We pray every day as a large group to begin our afterschool program. William loves to get up in front of everyone and pray (not to mention he does like the attention). He does have God's attention too, for our Father in heaven does have a special place for these little ones. God has a beautiful plan to care for and prosper them. And every so often we get to be part of His marvelous plan to give us hope and a future. Thank you for your support of this work.



UCATION

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Hospitality House Urban Learning Center (ULC)

The Urban Learning Center is made up of two main programs, our After School and Summer programs. The After School Program is a comprehensive program that offers Kindergarten through 12th grade students structured academics with a focus on establishing strong basic skills in Language Arts, Math, Science and **Character Development.** The program is open Monday through Friday, 2 to 6pm during the school year. Our summer program, is called Summer Spot that runs all day long. This is an intensive eight week summer program with the mornings dedicated to academic skill building. Licensed teachers and educational assistants work with students on grade level appropriate lessons and materials that correlate with Minnesota Standards. The Summer Spot afternoons are full of fun activities including field trips, swimming, STEM, crafts and cooking projects and other life skill training. Every day students spend tie studying the Bible and learning about God.



ATHLETICS

Hospitality House offers basketball, baseball and tennis. Through our athletic teams. we teach the importance of health and fitness, teamwork, integrity, and excellence. Athletics provide healthy recreational activities and positive motivation to stay in school. Basketball is the most popular athletic activity. We continue to partner with InnerCity Tennis (ICT).

BASKETBALL

In FY2021 we had two basketball teams due to the COVID-19 pandemic for a total of 21 participants with a 12u, 13u team. These teams had a wonderful time playing basketball, learning the game and developing their skills while gaining lifelong teamwork and leadership on and off the court.

Athletes of the Year 2021 Each year two athletes a young man and young woman are selected who show strong Christian character and values, on and off the field along with representing what God continues to accomplish at Hospitality House. The Christian Athlete of the year award honors

NEW STRATEGIES FOR OUR TEEN PROGRAM

The Teen Program is part of the Hospitality House Youth Development strategic plan. The Teen Program launched a pilot program September 2021 which includes weekly EDGE (Engage, Develop, Grow, Experience) Small Groups, EDGE Studio Workshop, a Bible study called FAMILY (Focusing All My Interactions In Loving You) and the latest program to launch, the Student Discipleship Group. This group focuses on helping students look at the biblical foundations for building strong disciples. We ask students to be committed to these groups for the entire school year and hope to walk with them into their young adult years.



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12 students attend EDGE Small Groups and nine attend FAMILY Bible study. 11 students attended a Fall Retreat in November. Through EDGE Small Groups and FAMILY, 17 middle and high school students accepted Christ.

PURPOSE AND FOCUS The Teen Program is

for grades 6th through 12th. We want to transition students into the Teen Program well; 5th grade students are invited to the Teen Program throughout the year to get a glimpse of each one of the Teen Program activities and the expectations for when they reach middle school. Leadership and entrepreneurship, career and college prep, arts and performance, creative club, discipleship, service and outreach, are all areas we will focus on more as our middle school students reach high school.

For the second year due to COVID-19 restrictions, the **Christmas with Dignity** program made adjustments to the event. Families drove up to receive their gifts instead of coming to shop in the Hospitality House Holiday Shop. With the shortage of Christmas presents in 2021 each family and child received a \$25 Target gift card and a tote bag full of toys, a book and a Bible, which were all donated by our generous donors. 420 families were served and 1,256 children.



With Covid diminishing Hospitality House was once again able to hold our annual **Black History Night** on Friday February 19th. It was an exciting night, where over people were able to come to see their children sing, dance, and display their talents and work. The highlight of the evening was each class did a project decorating their room doors with various topics; athletes, entertainers, inventors and more. Each person was able to tour the building looking at and appreciating the excellent work our students did.





Building Bridges Through Basketball with the Minneapolis **Police Department and RBC** Hospitality House and the MPD continue to build bridges of trust through basketball. In August 2021 a skills competition between Hospitality House youth and several Minneapolis Police Officers was held. 

"There have been so many educated black male mentors to guide my boys in the right direction." Malika said. Having an enrichment program like Hospitality House to guide the boys that was small and not rowdy was very important to Malika. She has three boys Amaja (20) Jabriel (17) and Jaron (10). All of her boys have played basketball at Hospitality House. "Put your all into it" Amaja said has been instilled in him by the coaches at Hospitality House. He still carries this with him today to not give up or get down. Keeping good grades and seeing the positive results of studying and hard work do pay off. As a senior this year at Loring Nicollet Alternative High School (LNAS) Jabriel is taking college generals at MCTC through the D3 program. "Hospitality House has kept me productive, active and out of trouble. They have kept me busy!" said Jabriel. Malika credits all of this through the partnership Hospitality House has with Step Up, which helped him earn additional high school credits to graduate early this spring. "I'm speechless, they have done so much for me and my family school-wise academically and even some hard personal issues the staff has been there for our family." said Malika. She continued, "I'm grateful they are still here to help Jaron!" As the youngest of the three boys Jaron is happy and excited to attend Hospitality House like his older brothers. "It feels good to have two older brothers to help me." Jaron said. The whole family has found Christ by attending Hospitality House.



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


